The BCEDA Economic Reconciliation Award includes submissions for partnerships, agreements and activities that advance shared economic reconciliation work.



## **Community Project Award**

The BCEDA Community Project Award recognizes an organization that has implemented various economic development initiatives that provide economic benefits to a community or region.

## **Community Resiliency Award**

This category includes submissions for programs, activities, and projects that represent a successful recovery initiative from natural and man-made disasters, including the loss of a major employer, housing and labour shortages as well as submissions that represent replicable measures undertaken to promote long term resiliency and/or sustainability from future disasters.

**Winner (community more than 25,000 population):** Kootenay Employment Services - Rural Entrepreneurship Development (RED) Program

## **Chair's Award**

The Chair's Award is presented annually to recognize a member of BCEDA who has made a significant contribution towards the profession of economic development as well as the function, goals and/or mandate of the BC Economic Development Association.
